4a. Promoting the production and distribution of energy derived from renewable sources

European Regional Development Fund

Focus: - Increasing the amount of renewable energy

- Micro energy schemes

Key Changes:

- Micro energy less than 5MW
- Micro energy schemes can be a minimum of £500,000
- Gas fired CHP is eligible as a low carbon energy source
- RHI can be used alongside ERDF but not FIT's
- Biomass Projects
- Projects simply installing renewables wouldn't necessarily be approved, projects will need to consider A61 even if under €1m
- Sewers in the Midlands
- Energy Share (could also be in 4a) Warrington Borough
 Council simple smart grid

4b. Promoting energy efficiency and renewable energy use in enterprises

Focus – Increasing the energy efficiency of SME's

Key Changes: Standard Retrofit is eligible

- Projects need to provide a diagnostic
- Has to be energy and not resource efficiency
- Match funding can come from the SME
- Grant support for equipment is eligible.





4c. Supporting energy efficiency, smart energy management and renewable energy use in public infrastructure, including in public buildings, and in the housing sector

Focus: Delivering innovation in public building and housing.

Key Changes

- Solid wall Insulation can be eligible
- What is a public building
- Innovative technologies & processes that can demonstrate opportunities for others.
- Public & Private housing
- A number of projects coming forward with off site construction





4e. Promoting low-carbon strategies for all types of territories, in particular for urban areas, including the promotion of sustainable multimodal urban mobility and mitigation-relevant adaptation measures

Focus: Combining low carbon activity to deliver a whole place solution

No Changes in the Guidance

- Low Carbon Strategy required to give the activity context
- Provides flexible approach to deliver a range of activity
- Can deliver low carbon transport as part of a package
 - Eligible low carbon transport
- Geographical focus, activity can't be disparate e.g.
 - Business Park, Hospital or university campus with low carbon transport out
 - City centre or specific urban area
 - · Series of market towns



4f. Promoting research and innovation in, and adoption of, low-carbon technologies

Focus: Research and development providing knowledge exchange

No changes to the Guidance

- Developing proof of concept
- Need to be consistent with Smart Specialisation Strategy in England
- Technologies should meet the Low Carbon Innovation Coordination Group
